TRADE DESCRIPTION: Assess injuries, administer emergency medical care, and extricate trapped individuals. Transport injured or sick persons to medical facilities. Administers first-aid treatment and life support. Assesses nature and extent of illness or injury. Observes, records, and reports patient's condition. Operates emergency response vehicles. Maintains vehicles and medical and communication equipment, and replenishes first-aid equipment and supplies. ****NOTE**** Completion of this Apprenticeship does NOT license nor does it guarantee that the Apprentice will be entitled to challenge or be allowed to take the State licensing/certification exams. Each State is sovereign and controls their own licensing procedure.

TASK PERFORMANCE: Demonstrate knowledge and skills for qualifying as Journeyman. Applicable Job Qualification Requirements will be used as a guide in performing tasks and demonstrating knowledge in the following skill areas. Actual work time must be recorded in the Work Experience Log; each skill area must be completed.

TRADE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

Service Member assigned, trained and working full time in this trade occupation;

Have a minimum of 12 months remaining on active duty when beginning this trade apprenticeship;

Agree to abide by the National Standards of Apprenticeship.

Related Instruction:

Trade related On-The-Job-Training (OJT) or Any Trade related schools/courses totaling 216 or more hours.

A	FIRST AID -- Administer first aid treatment or life support care to sick or injured persons in prehospital settings.	1250

	-- Operate equipment, such as electrocardiograms (EKGs), external defibrillators, or bag valve mask resuscitators, in advanced life support environments. -- Perform emergency diagnostic and treatment procedures, such as stomach suction, airway management, or heart monitoring, during Emergency vehicle/medevac transport. -- Observe, record, and report to physician the patient's condition or injury, the treatment provided, and reactions to drugs or treatment. -- Assess nature and extent of illness or injury to establish and prioritize medical procedures. -- Immobilize patient for placement on stretcher and ambulance/medevac transport, using backboard or other spinal immobilization device. -- Comfort and reassure patients.	
B	COORDINATE -- Coordinate work with other emergency medical team members or police or fire department personnel. -- Coordinate with treatment center personnel to obtain patients' vital statistics and medical history, to determine the circumstances of the emergency, and to administer emergency treatment.	400
C	MEDICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE VEHICLE -- Drive mobile intensive care unit to specified location, following instructions from emergency medical dispatcher. -- Decontaminate ambulance interior following treatment of patient with infectious disease and report case to proper authorities. -- Maintain vehicles and medical communication equipment and replenish first aid equipment and supplies. -- Communicate with dispatchers or treatment center personnel to provide information about situation, to arrange reception of victims, or to receive instructions for further treatment.	750
D	MEDICATIONS -- Administer drugs, orally or by injection, or perform intravenous procedures under a physician's direction. -- Maintain inventory of medicines. -- Collaborate with healthcare professionals to plan or provide treatment.	300
E	TRAINING	300

	-- Attend training classes to maintain certification licensure, keep abreast of new developments in the field, or maintain existing knowledge. -- Participate in mass casualty drills and other emergency response scenarios.	
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
