Apr 23, Greg rated it liked it Shelves: greek. I liked the Reading Greek: Grammar and Exercises approach, thought it was a very easy way to learn Greek. The presentation of the grammar was so-so. Some topics, I am told, are badly explained. On other topics, you'd expect the book to explain more and give a sense of what is coming in the future.

The book introduces the middle voice, for instance, without saying anything about how it is to be translated. And there is not much indication of which paradigms absolutely must be memorized as soon Reading Greek: Grammar and Exercises you learn them, and I liked the reading-focused approach, thought it was a very easy way to learn Greek.

An excellent review for those who have some previous experience with ancient Greek. RG focuses on Attic, but the last couple of chapters breeze through Ionic Herodotus and Homeric dialects as well. If you are primarily interested in learning New Testament Greek, there are easier ways to go.

The two companion volumes to this one are Reading Greek: Text and Reading Greek: Grammar and Exercises. The former contains the actual readings, and the latter contains the answer key for the exercises, the English translations, and many crucial hints. The first two volumes are useless without each other, and the Study Guide is almost indispensable.

Get all three if you're going the JACT route. I really like the fact that Reading Greek gets the student out of paradigm drill and into reading actual texts almost immediately.

There really is only one reason to learn Ancient Greek, and that is to read the ancient texts. So getting to the texts on Day One is highly motivating. My only complaints are 1. Flipping from the reading to the grammar books is a bit cumbersome couldn't they have combined them into one book, with the reading on one side and the vocabulary on the other? The font is too small. My reading vision is good, yet I frequently found myself squinting to make out diacritical marks.
